1	<p><b>Chairman's introduction – David Lansdowne</b> DL welcomed everybody to the meeting and handed to MB for the body of the meeting.</p>

4	<p><b>MB</b> circulated a paper setting out the aims of the session:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) Decide of a working vision statement, based on the analysis of evidence from the community.</li> <li>b) Hear, discuss and agree objectives and policies from each group: Housing, Business, Environment, Transport, Facilities.</li> <li>c) Iron our any duplication, overlaps and underlaps</li> <li>d) For each group consider:             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Sources of evidence needed for each policy</li> <li>2) Rationale/justification if not already provided</li> </ol> </li> </ol> <p>MB reported that he had commenced working on the layout and would be submitting a draft to the comms group. There is a new CC template to be considered. MB was recording the meeting to assist him in drafting the plan.</p> <p>The session continued with everybody asked to consider the vision statement and select a 'style'. Each attendee provided a written idea which would be passed to Jane Moss for a Vision Statement to be drafted.</p> <p><b>Jan Robson</b> reported on the Environment Group. PF has produced a considerable body of work with 4 draft policies:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1 Protecting and enhancing the landscape</li> <li>2 Panoramic Views</li> <li>3 Creek and Riverside</li> <li>4 Land Use</li> </ol> <p>How related maps are incorporated into the plan needs careful consideration.</p> <p><b>Tim Brighton</b> reported on the Transport Group As a result of the group's work in analysing the main survey and carrying out subsidiary targeted surveys 4 policies have been drafted covering public transport, accessibility and road safety, parking, PROWs and cycle routes.</p> <p><b>Beccy Brougham and Sophie McGannity</b> reported on the Facilities group with 4 draft policies:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1 Schools and education – support for a new school</li> <li>2 Facilities – maintaining dentist/GP/retail etc</li> <li>3 Review and support existing facilities and public buildings with upgrades and change of use if appropriate.</li> </ol>	

	<p>4 Green Spaces – protect existing from encroachment and provide new public spaces.</p> <p><b>Nick Trefusis and John Killick</b> reported on the Economy group and produced several draft policies for consideration. (Due to his situation as a significant land owner in the Parish NT is stepping down from the Steering Group and John Killick is taking his place).</p> <p>Due to lack of time and its overarching importance it was decided to defer the Housing Group’s report until the next meeting.</p>
